Things you might want to ask

Do you need to join as a financial member to be a Blue Bandage Player?

When you sign up to become a Blue Bandage player, you will need to go through a polocrosse club. This is correct pathway to polocrosse; however, we do not want to pressure new player into a "club" scene on their first day.

Can you be a Blue Bandage player in any grade playing with white bandage players?

No, Blue Bandage Polocrosse is designed for players to play in a non-contact environment. This will null and void your insurance. However, you can pay to upgrade your membership anytime you want and play white bandage polocrosse.

Is Blue Bandage Polocrosse a grade of its own?

❖ No, Blue Bandage Polocrosse is non-competitive and is not graded.

How long can you be a Blue Bandage player?

As long as the player abides by the Blue Bandage Polocrosse rules; non-competitive, low to no contact, no swinging, slow pace, safe and easy access to goals.

Can a player that has played polocrosse in previous years play in a Blue Bandage competition?

Yes, as long as the player abides by the Blue Bandage Polocrosse rules; non-competitive, low to no contact, no swinging, slow pace, safe and easy access to goals.

What do you do if you only have one Blue Bandage Polocrosse player wanting to participate?

The organising club can find some white bandages members who are willing to play a chukka or two with the Blue Bandage player. This happened at a Victorian carnival, the club rallied a number of white bandage players who were willing to have a game of Blue Bandage (many of them with green horses). This Blue Bandage person was able to get one on one coaching and has a great day.
